At some stage over the summer, we are also going to plant a new tree in the Church garden to mark this special occasion.

From all of us at St Mary's Parish Church, we wish Her Majesty the Queen every blessing on her Platinum Jubilee and thank her for her faithful and dedicated service to our country.

At St Mary's Parish Church, our Summer Services, from 3rd July to 14th August, will be 45 minutes long - with our children and young people going directly to Summer Activities in the halls. The Summer Theme is yet to be decided but may possibly be the "I Am Statements of Jesus".

Summer 2022 will also see the resumption of our annual week-long Summer Club for children of Primary School age.

We have lots to look forward to this Summer as a congregation.

CANDIDATES FOR THE MINISTRY

In recent years, we have been very blessed to have some wonderful Candidates for the Ministry doing their practical training with us at St Mary's Parish Church.

Sunday 5th June will be our final service with Hazel Shaw. Hazel has been a joy to work with and has made a real impact upon the congregation. We wish Hazel all God's blessings as she moves on to her Probationary Placement at East Kilbride Old Parish Church.

The following Sunday, 12th June, we have a new Candidate for the Ministry, Dawn Westwood, joining us for the Summer. Dawn's ten-week placement will be a fulltime one and we look forward to getting to know her and enjoying her ministry among us.

Alongside practical training, Candidates for the Ministry also undertake degree studies and I am delighted to let you know that all 3 of our students of recent years, Fiona Anderson, Jillian Storrie, and Hazel Shaw have all completed their degrees and will be graduating at the beginning of July. Congratulations to each and all of them!

MOVE FORWARD IN FAITH

In the New Year Edition of the Church Bulletin, I intimated that *St Mary's Parish Church* Kirk Session would be reviewing our Five-Year Mission Plan - much of which was put on hold during the various Covid lockdowns. This new plan "Move Forward In Faith" is almost completed and ready to go.

Concurrently, the new Presbytery of Forth Valley and Clydesdale, of which the former Hamilton Presbytery is now a part, is working with congregations to establish a new Presbytery Plan. All Presbyteries in Scotland are undergoing this process as a direct instruction from last year's General Assembly. The Presbytery Plan must take account of the fact that there will be a 40% reduction in Ministry Personnel by 2025. This reduction is due to more Ministers retiring than starting training, and a lack of funding for Ministers and Church Buildings at the national and local level.

During the initial consultation process period, which took place in the lead up to Easter, the Kirk Session of St Mary's Parish Church gave a very strong account of our congregation and its strategic importance within the Motherwell Community. Like all congregations in the new Presbytery of Forth Valley and Clydesdale we are now awaiting the publication of the Presbytery's Draft Plan.

As I said in the last Church Bulletin, every single one of us needs to play our part if we want to assure the future of our congregation. A bustling Sunday Congregation, a vibrant Junior Church, and busy and active Church Organisations, for all ages, are the foundations on which we must build as we seek to reach out into our Parish and Community in the days ahead.

CHURCH PRAYER CHAIN

I am delighted to say that our new Church Prayer Chain, which was launched by Hazel, earlier this year, is already proving a real blessing to the congregation.

If you wish to be a part of the Prayer Chain all you need to do is to contact me and pass on your e-mail address.

Each Wednesday evening a list of prayer points is e-mailed out to all those on the chain. You can then pray through these points at your leisure. The prayer points are a mixture of requests from the congregation as well as more general items.

If you wish to submit a prayer request, you can write that request on a Prayer Card and place it in one of the secure Prayer Boxes at the Church Vestibule and Hall Entrance. Alternatively, you can email or call myself and I will be happy to add your request.

As Hazel leaves, my wife Helen, and Margaret Carrol, will be supporting me with the Prayer Chain Ministry in the days and months ahead.

FINANCE REPORT

The report to the 25th May 2022 makes interesting reading.

The amount of giving through plate and through Standing Order has increased by 8.1%. However total income from all sources has dropped.

Expenditure, compared to the same period last year, has increased, mainly due to the increase in our payments to the Church of Scotland. These payments for Ministry and Mission have been reinstated to the pre-pandemic level of £91,500 for the year. We pay this amount in 9 instalments beginning in April 2022 through to December 2022. We also paid in January an increased Presbytery charge of £3248 which is an increase from last year of £1,808. Another area of increased expenditure is in our gas bills. Obviously over the pandemic time the Church was closed and fuel was only used to ensure the pipes did not freeze, over the winter period. Our first quarterly bill was larger than expected and this would appear to be the norm for the future.

As always I try to be positive about our financial situation and at a time of great hardship for many, your financial support has been exceptional. Your support is greatly appreciated and will be extremely important over the next few months and years to stave off the effects of inflation.

Stuart Reid our Treasurer has estimated that once all our bills are paid we might have a deficit of over £12,000 at the end of the financial year. We have Reserves and a surplus over the years in our Congregational Account, so, in the short term there is no need to panic. However, if we continue to have deficits on a yearly basis our reserves will not last long.

The Finance Committee will continue to monitor income and expenditure and as always I will keep you informed as to our Financial position.
