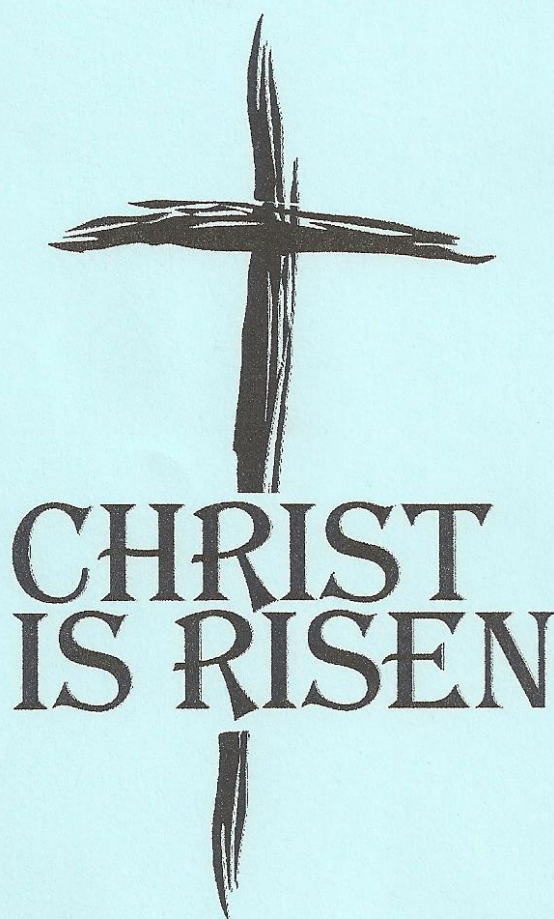

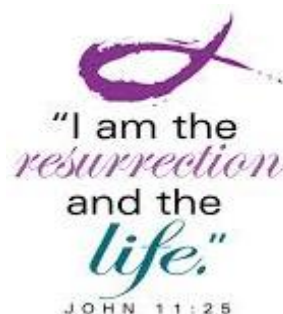

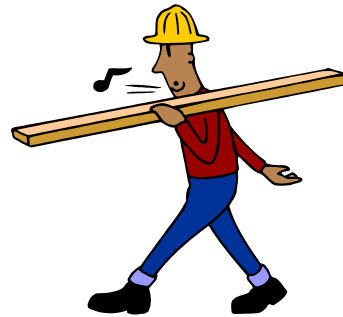
**The Cleaning Team** continue to meet every 4/6 weeks to help with the duties in the church sanctuary and in our halls and corridors.

## THE GUILD

The new session began on Monday 9 January with a visit from Colin Ogilvie, speaking on his work in the community in Overtown and his new career in photography. The following week our speaker from the Scottish Refugee Council had a personal emergency and we gratefully had an entertaining and informative talk from Rev John Thomson who stepped in at the very last minute. We continued our session with Scottish entertainment provided by Jim Hughes and a most interesting talk by John Harden ED Consultant at Wishaw General, when we learned much of what goes on behind the scenes in the Emergency Department.

We continued to be entertained most ably by a variety of guests. Naida Meek had us singing along to a variety of songs from Musicals after challenging us to identify the songs and Yvonne Waring entertained us using the various voices of Joyce Grenfell. Knowetop Primary School Choir provided delightful singing prior to our AGM.



We had a visit from Ivy Blair who gave us much information on our Project: Prospects - All Friends Together which is about helping churches to welcome people with learning disabilities and include them in all aspects of church life and to build friendships - with Jesus and with other church members. Our fundraising Coffee Evening raised over £270 which when added to other monies raised will mean we can send around £340 to this project.

We had a most interesting talk from the Olive Tree Scotland organisation which aims

to promote a wider understanding of the situation in the Holy Land today including Israel-Palestine issues. They help support people, especially women and children who suffer deprivation in the current situation. We were able to buy crafts from Palestine, which give employment, income and hope to those in a difficult economic situation.



As we moved towards the end of our session we had a joint panel night with the Men's Fellowship when many topical issues were discussed with seriousness and humour. We are grateful to Alan Joyce Jnr for compering this evening and for Andrew Livingstone, Stuart McCue-Dick, Laura St John and Barbara Aitkenhead for giving their views on such diverse subjects as the potential loss of Motherwell's public toilets to the Spaceport plans for Prestwick Airport.

Robert Neilson provided us with a most interesting evening bringing us up to date with the work of the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service. No one told the Guild secretary that dressing up was in her job description.



We now look forward to our final meetings when we welcome the Rev Joanne Hood, and Same Difference singers to our closing social. We round off the session with our outing to Culzean Castle and Ayr this year.

We hope that the ladies of the congregation get a flavour of what happens at the Guild on Monday evenings from our reports and more will join in our fellowship in the new session.

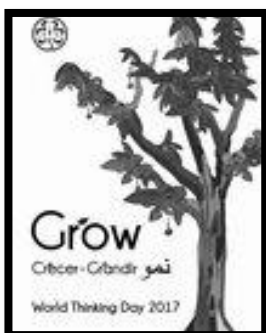

# UPDATE

As part of the Disasters Emergency Committee, Christian Aid is asking for help with the crisis in East Africa.

People are dying daily from hunger and malnutrition across East Africa in the worst humanitarian crisis since 1945.

Famine has been declared in parts of South Sudan, where 100,000 people face starvation and nearly 5 million people urgently need food. This crisis follows more than 3 years of devastating conflict, which has left millions of people without a safe place to call home.

The situation is also grave in Somalia, Kenya and Ethiopia where 14 million people are going hungry every day, caught up in the region's worst drought in 50 years. In Somalia alone, over 360,000 children under 5 are extremely malnourished.

In South Sudan, Christian Aid's partners have long been providing life-saving help: distributing seeds, farming tools and fishing gear so families can access nutritious food. They have also provided agricultural training, repaired community water points, built latrines and handed out sanitation and hygiene supplies.

In Kenya and Ethiopia, Christian Aid's partners are ready to respond in some of the worst-affected areas. In Somalia, the organization plans to work with ACT Alliance sister agencies to provide support.

**In April and May, there will be a series of fund-raising events here in St Mary's for Christian Aid.**

**On Thursday 27 April at 7 pm, there will be a CONCERT, featuring all 3 of St Mary's choirs, (Church Choir, Junior Choir and In-betweeners) local school choirs and guest soloists.**

**On Christian Aid Sunday, 14 May, CAST will host a lunch after the morning service.**

**The house-to-house collection will run from 14<sup>th</sup> - 20<sup>th</sup> May.**

**The 'Long March' in Strathclyde Park will take place on Sunday 21 May.**

There will be an information evening in Motherwell South Parish Church on Tuesday, 25 April at which staff members from Christian Aid Scotland will give feedback on Christian Aid's work and current challenges.

Please continue to support Christian Aid with your usual generosity.

What a joy to see new growth in our gardens, blossom decorating the trees and daffodils in splendour. "A host of golden daffodils" the poet Wm Wordsworth wrote when admiring their beauty. A welcome sight for us all as we move forward into Spring.

The Scottish Bible Society and Bible Societies throughout the world are engaged in projects to aid countries whose people suffer through famine, war, global disasters and persecution. Many people go to these countries to help and support them in their time of need. Here, at home, another way of supporting those countries is by publicising their plight, donating money and goods, fundraising and very importantly, upholding them in prayer.

The Motherwell Action Group receives a lot of information and advice from Bible House on charities which are being supported in the coming year and, after much consideration, the group chose the project 'Haiti - New Words : New Life'. It's not easy to choose a project when there are so many other worthwhile causes.

You may remember Hurricane Matthew which struck Haiti last October and directly affected 1,000,000 people. The immediate priority, at that time, was to provide accommodation and urgently needed supplies as well as repair to as much of the infrastructure as possible. The current priority is to help people rebuild their lives particularly in the area of trauma healing. People are looking for both comfort and hope and to that end the project is providing 200,000 copies of the Bible in Creole and French and 2000 copies of the New Testament. However, 60% of Haiti's population are illiterate so a literacy programme has been set up. Not only does this programme teach people to read and write, but opens up opportunities for new work.

At the time of writing our fundraising concert has still to be held on Saturday, 25<sup>th</sup> March in St Mary's. 'Brats & Callets' will entertain us with an evening of popular songs and ballads. I'll be in a position, at a later date, to let you know the amount that was raised for our project. Our group would like to thank you for your continued support and prayers.
