Dear Friends:

<u>First Year</u>

As I write as Parish Minister, for the Summer edition of the Church Magazine, I realise that I am almost a year now at St Mary's Parish Church. I can't believe how time flies!

On behalf of myself, my wife and our whole family, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all very much for making us feel so welcome and at home in Motherwell. It is a delight to be a part of such a fabulous church with so many excellent people of all ages.

Amongst the highlights of my first year have been the opportunities to share in the great festivals of the Christian Calendar: Harvest, Christmas, Easter and Pentecost. I have also enjoyed several Communions, Baptisms and Weddings, Church Social Events, School Assemblies and the annual Summer Holiday Club.

On a different, sadder note, it has also been my privilege to take part in the Funeral Services of some very fine Members of the Church and local community. Funerals are never easiest part of Parish Ministry, but it is always an honour to be asked by a family to share in the celebration of the life of their loved one. My very first task as Parish Minister, the day after my Induction last June, was to take part in the Dalziel High School Prizegiving 2017. This year's Prizegiving is fast approaching on Thursday 21 June - a reminder that I have a whole host of services and events to look forward to again in the coming year! One of the first will be the Summer Club - which will take place from Monday 23 to Friday 27 July.

Prayer Walk

During the Summer months, as folks go on holiday, many Church events and activities take a well-earned break. Summer can also be an opportunity, though, to try something new. This Summer, on the evening of Wednesday 11 July, the Kirk Session have decided to hold a Prayer Walk round different areas of our parish.

A Prayer Walk is a very gentle but effective way to demonstrate that we, as a Parish Church, are at the very heart of our community.

If you would like to take part, we will meet in the Avon Hall at 7.30 pm. Folks, in groups of twos or threes, will then take a short walk around a section of our parish - no more than a few streets. The idea is that, as you walk, you use your senses to lead you in prayer for the people and places you encounter. For example, if you are walking through the Duchess Park and see and hear children playing on the swings, this may lead you to pray [silently in your heart and mind] for the children and young people of our community.

After our short walk, we will then meet back up again in the Avon Hall for some refreshments and a quick de-brief.

The Prayer Walk is open to folks of all ages and will be a fun, enjoyable and spiritually rewarding experience. Let's hope the weather is kind to us!

Parish Visitation

Two new housing estates are currently being built in our parish: Hermitage Gate and Springfield. In early July, just the schools start back. before volunteers from the Kirk Session will take out a warm welcome on behalf of St Mary's Parish Church to the first of the new residents who have started to move in to these estates. This welcome will include an updated Parish Leaflet detailing some of the many services and activities which are open, at St Mary's, to folks of all ages in our community.

Pastoral Words

Earlier in this letter, I mentioned the privilege that it is to take part in the Funeral Services of very fine Members of the Church and local community. Occasionally, as a Parish Minister, holidays and illness can prevent a Minister from being able to do this.

Sadly, I was unable to share in the Funeral Service of a very fine lady: Mrs Irene Colquhoun. Due to failing health, Irene spent her latter days in Douglas View Care Home in Hamilton. Irene was a well loved and greatly respected Member of St Mary's Parish Church and I would like, as Minister, to pay tribute to her life of love and faith. Her husband, David, and the family continue to be in our thoughts and prayers.

Closing Thoughts

During the School Summer Holidays, our Sunday Services will be shorter [45 minutes]. If the weather is kind, this will allow you to make the most of the rest of the day!

There will also be Summer Activities in the Church Halls for our children and young people.

Wherever you go this Summer, whether you stay at home or travel far abroad, may you know the peace and blessing of God.

Christian Aid continues to work in many countries, with some of the most deprived people in our world.

For example, the charity is working with its partners in Syria, Lebanon and Iraq, to provide support to some of the most vulnerable Syrian refugees.

In Lebanon, its partner Association Najdeh provides aid to Palestinian refugees from Syria, while Mouvement Social ensures that refugee children can continue their education and also access psychological support to come to terms with their experiences. Lebanese organisation Kafa, which supports women who have experienced exploitation and domestic violence, now opens its doors for the most vulnerable female refugees in the Bekka Valley. In Iraq, Asuda has been giving refugee social and psychological women legal, support. Rehabilitation, Education and Community Health (REACH) has also provided vocational training to some of the most vulnerable refugee communities living in the Kurdish region of northern Iraq, to help them find a way to make a living.

Within Syria itself, Christian Aid is supporting partners providing hot meals to people recently displaced by the bombing of towns north east of Damascus.

While the flow of people crossing through Greece and the Balkans to find sanctuary in Europe has slowed, thousands of families, children and vulnerable adults remain stranded for long periods of time in informal settlements, camps or temporary shelters. Christian Aid's partners in Serbia and Greece continue to provide direct support to these refugees.

Your support helps Christian Aid to continue its work in these situations and many others. Our concert in Motherwell South Parish Church in April, in which all 3 of St Mary's choirs took part, raised £1400. Christian Aid Week began with our young people, all wearing something red, coming into church to hear Wendy Young of Christian Aid telling them about Zaza (the little girl in Haiti who is the focus of Christian Aid's publicity this year) who had to live for 5 months in a house with no roof. Christian Aid's response is 'Together we're stronger than storms.'
