I hope you have had an enjoyable time over the festive season. As I write this report, it was only a week ago when we were celebrating the New Year and I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a happy, healthy and peaceful time in 2020.

The Scottish Bible Society has had a very busy year. A project, held close to its members, was the setting up and leading a global initiative called **Bible 2020**. This is a major digital campaign and was launched on New Year's Day to encourage "everyone, everywhere" to read the Bible. The campaign was originally intended only for Scotland but has instead launched as a global campaign, with Bible Societies from more than 85 countries now involved in the movement. **Bible 2020's** aim is for Christians to take the words of the Bible off the pages and speak them out loud in their daily lives.

Elaine Duncan, Chief Executive Officer of the SBS said, "There's something about speaking words out loud that make them more real. The Bible traditionally was passed down orally, but both this tradition and deep confidence in Scripture have been lost over the generations. We hope this campaign will encourage Christians to rediscover confidence in the Bible and the power of speaking God's Word aloud. It may also stimulate people into starting a habit of reading the Bible daily through this year."

There are 366 days of short inspirational readings in **Bible 2020**. The reading programme is available for download by visiting www.bible2020.org. Through prayer and the reading of God's Word, people's lives might be transformed and the world changed significantly by the power of His Word.

The Motherwell Action Group of the SBS is holding a concert in Crosshill Parish Church on Saturday, 1^{st} February at 7 pm. Studio 32 Theatre Company will be our entertainment. They are a very talented group of singers and they will also perform a short act from 'The Steamie'. It should prove to be a great night to be enjoyed by all. Tickets are priced at £6 which includes refreshments and can be bought from Margaret Carrol or from the church office.

The project we are supporting from the proceeds of the concert is "The Bread of Life - Children at Risk in Lima, Peru". The aim of the project is to contribute to the integral development (nutritional and spiritual) of 1186 poor children who live in rural communities. A supply of nutritious breakfasts, snacks and lunches in addition to Scriptures and teachings of the Bible, appropriate for age and need, would be provided.
