Dear Friends:

THE DEATH OF HM QUEEN ELIZABETH II

In the Summer Edition of our St Mary's Bulletin, I had the honour of paying tribute to Her Majesty The Queen who, on 6th February this year, became the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, marking 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms, and the Commonwealth.

To celebrate this remarkable achievement, St Mary's Parish Church held a Platinum Jubilee Afternoon Tea on Saturday 5^{th} June and a Celebratory Service on Sunday 6^{th} June. We then planted a new tree in the Church Garden in Her Majesty The Queen's honour.

It is with great sadness that I write this Autumn Edition of our St Mary's Bulletin, having just heard the news of the death of Her Majesty The Queen at Balmoral Castle earlier today.

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II lived a remarkable life and achieved so much on behalf our nation and its people. She saw 15 Prime Minister's come and go and delivered 68 Christmas Day Messages. She enjoyed some remarkable and happy Jubilee Celebrations. She also, however, guided the country through some very difficult times - not least during the recent COVID-19 Pandemic. In a direct address to the Nation on Sunday 5th April 2020, the Queen spoke words of comfort and encouragement: "While we have faced challenges before, this one is different," she said. "This time we join with all nations across the globe in a common endeavour, using the great advances of science and our instinctive compassion to heal.

We will succeed - and that success will belong to every one of us."

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II will be remembered for many things. Not least, for her commitment to the Church and her own personal Christian Faith - which meant so much to her. In her Christmas Day Address to the Nation in 2014, she said this: "For me, the life of Jesus Christ, the Prince of Peace, whose birth we celebrate today, is an inspiration and an anchor in my life. A role model of reconciliation and forgiveness, he stretched out his hands in love, acceptance, and healing. Christ's example has taught me to seek to respect and value all people of whatever faith or none."

As we move into a Ten-Day Period of Official Mourning we, at Motherwell St Mary's Parish Church, give thanks for the life and love of our longest serving Monarch, Queen Elizabeth II. We also hold our new King, Charles III, and all the Royal Family in our thoughts and prayers at this sad time.

A Book of Condolence will be available to sign in St Mary's in the fortnight ahead. The Church will also be open to broadcast the 2 Services of Memorial for HM Majesty Queen Elizabeth II on the large screen in the sanctuary - the first of these services will be held in Edinburgh Giles Cathedral and the latter at Westminster Abbey. The dates of these services are - Monday 12th [3:00 PM] and Monday 19th [11:00 AM] September. Please note that these times are currently approximations. Please refer to the news or social media for further confirmation. The church will be open for an hour beforehand. on each occasion, for people to gather in silent prayer as they arrive. I would respectfully request that people remain silent, as they arrive, to allow a spirit of mourning, honour, and respect in the sanctuary.

DRAFT PRESBYTERY PLAN

Enclosed, with the paper copy of the Bulletin, is a copy of the Draft Presbytery Plans for the Motherwell Area. As you will see, our Church Building is earmarked to be retained as a key centre for public worship. This is undoubtably good news.

More difficult to understand, perhaps, is the Presbytery Planning Committee's desire for us to enter into a Union with 5 other local congregations: North Motherwell, Crosshill, Motherwell South, St Margaret's, and Craigneuk and Belhaven. At a special Kirk Session held to discuss the Draft Plan there was no great enthusiasm for the idea of a multiple Union.

Dalziel St Andrew's would be in a separate Union with Newarthill and Carfin Parish Church.

A meeting with the Presbytery Planning Groups, to ask questions of the Draft Plan and to make alternative suggestions, was due to be held on the evening of Thursday 8th September. The Session Clerks, Jennifer Bradshaw, and I were the nominated representatives of our Kirk Session to attend this meeting. Due to the sad news of the death of the Queen, however, the meeting correctly was cancelled. A new date for this meeting is set for Tuesday 20th September at 7.00 pm. After this meeting the Kirk Session is due to meet again to make a formal written response to the Draft Presbytery Plan by October 3rd.

Please pray for all involved in this important process including the Presbytery Planning Team and our own Kirk Session.

If you have any questions about the Draft Presbytery Plan, please let me know and I will do my best to provide and answer.

CHURCH PRAYER CHAIN

I am delighted to say that our new Church Prayer Chain, which was launched earlier this year, is continuing to provide a real blessing to the congregation. If you wish to be a part of the Prayer Chain all you need to do is to contact me and pass on your e-mail address.

Each Wednesday evening a list of prayer points is e-mailed out to all those on the chain. You can then pray through these points at your leisure. The prayer points are a mixture of requests from the congregation as well as more general items.

If you wish to submit a prayer request, you can write that request on a Prayer Card and place it in one of the secure Prayer Boxes at the Church Vestibule and Hall Entrance. Alternatively, you can e-mail or call myself and I will be happy to add your request.

STUDENT MINISTERS

One of my favourite tasks in Ministry is being entrusted by the Faith Nurture Committee at 121 to supervise Students in Training for the Ministry. I have had this privilege now for 20 years.

In recent years, in St Mary's Parish Church, it has been a joy to supervise some high-quality students who, I know, will go on to make fantastic Parish Ministers and OLM's.

It was sad to say goodbye to Dawn Westwood on Sunday 4th September. It was a real pleasure to work with her over the Summer. Dawn's Summer Placement was a ten-week full-time one and she had the opportunity to be involved in many aspects of our congregational life. I know that she touched many lives during her short time with us.

On Harvest Sunday [Sunday 2nd October], we will be joined by a new Student in Training for the Full-Time Ministry of Word and Sacrament within the Church of Scotland. Her name is Eleanor Hamilton. I am very much looking forward to Eleanor starting training with me and am sure she will receive a warm welcome at St Mary's Parish Church. Eleanor's place is a parttime terms placement and will last until around Easter next year.

CLOSING WORDS

With the War in Ukraine, the energy and cost of living crisis, and now the loss our beloved Monarch, these are difficult times for all of us.

If you need any help or support, please contact me or your District Elder and we will do all that we can, as a Church Family, to support you. Finally, it has been my pleasure in recent days to Ordain 7 new Elders into our Kirk Session: Frazer Joyce, Alan Henderson, Kristeen Kennedy, Hilary Kidd, Ronald Mackay, Elaine Neilson, and Rosalind Ward. Please pray for our new Elders as they settle into their new role and Ministry within our congregation.

May the blessing of God: the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit be with you all.

Summer Camp 2022



It was wonderful to be back at BB Camp after missing 2 'real' camps!

In the few weeks leading up to setting off there was a definite excitement building (and that was just the officers!) about returning to Badaguish after the enforced break away.

Getting there.... Day 1

With 20 boys and 13 officers (all resplendent in our new royal blue BB hoodies), the convoy of 2 minibuses, the Witzenmann van and the Chapman's LandRover and trailer we managed to load up and ship out all our camping stuff and luggage for 5 days of adventure as we headed for Badaguish just outside Aviemore in the Cairngorms for our 2022 (Return to) Summer Camp.

After a lunch stop in Aviemore we descended on Badaguish and began the process of making ourselves at home - 10 tents had to go up, the kitchen had to be organised, 3 years of dust washed from our travelling crockery and utensils, the mammoth online shop had to be unpacked and the tuck shop retail outlet needed stocked and organised.

At Badaguish we have a great set-up that gives us best of both worlds - plenty of flat dry camping ground complemented by indoor cooking and dining facilities and a modern toilet/shower block.

The boys made an excellent job of setting up the tents so after an afternoon of settling in we enjoyed our first meal together and then set off for a stroll down to Loch Morlich. This is always the point at camp when we are reminded just how vicious the Aviemore midges are and how easy it is for boys to get wet feet!!

The (Dreaded) Hillwalk.... Day 2

Sunday is the traditional camp hillwalk and this year we took as slightly different approach and went for distance rather than height - we decided to walk the route from the campsite through to Nethy Bridge which would take in the Glenmore area, the Green Loch, Ryvoan Bothy and some spectacular forest tracks.

In addition to being a lovely walk this was to help us accommodate using the Paratreker again (first pioneered at Camp 2019!) to help one of our members fully participate in the adventure.

During the walk the boys were set a challenge to take photos as a tent grouping with a variety of things or in strange poses - the results were comical!

16 kilometres and a few rest stops later and we all arrived in Nethy Bridge where our minibus was waiting to take us back to the campsite.

Activity Days....Day 3 & 4

Monday and Tuesday were both days of organised activities where the main event of the day was provided by an outdoor activity company. This year we partnered with a new company Able2Adventure who are based at Badaguish and specialise in outdoor adventures for groups and those with additional mobility needs.

Over the 2 days the boys learned to paddle board on Loch Morlich, gorge walked the River Feshie at Feshie Bridge, rope climbed and abseiled back down Creag Bheag in Kingussie and mountain biked in the trails around Loch Morlich.

We had loads of fun moments particularly when 'helicoptering' on a giant paddle board or plunging into a deep pool on the gorge walk and all are captured on video ready to be edited into the camp film!

What else....?

In between all the planned activities the boys were kept entertained/busy by our staff team in football competitions, a quiz night and a big game of baseball on Loch Morlich beach.

Being back at Camp was brilliant and Summer Camp 2022 was another memorable camp in the perfect (if you forget the midges) location, awesome activities with a wonderful group of boys who have all come home with memories that will last a lifetime.

Camp 2023 is already booked for Sat 1^{st} to Wed 5^{th} July 2023 and we already have ideas for creating another memorable camp for everyone.....
